Selection Criteria:

Scholarship, as evidenced by overall GPA and performance in HDFS courses
Leadership and service in the department, college, university, and community

Minimum Requirements:

HDFS major (either concentration)
Completion of at least 60 hours by end of the current spring semester
Cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.4 or higher
